FORMAT FOR COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

- We use the 4 part model for worship – **gather, engage, respond and send**. Students are active participants in collective worship. This format is used for all Acts of Collective Worship.
- We use calming spiritual music at the beginning and end of worship.
- We gather together in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and greet each other in a call and response so we are prepared to meet with God. We include specific Anglican worship practices through our opening sentence and response and also by lighting a candle in prayer to remind us of God's Holy Spirit. This creates a distinctive atmosphere and a clearly visible focus point of readiness in Christ. This is often followed by the singing of a hymn or listening to the choir.
- We engage with the Bible, Christian teaching and, most importantly, God in the main part of our act of worship. We encounter Jesus and the stories of the Bible and we are listening for God's message to us. The message is shared through the reading of a Bible verse which we relate to our theme (which are linked to the liturgical calendar), our experience, current events, our values helps us think about how we can live more Christian lives in a loving and compassionate way.
- Time is set aside for reflection and thinking and responding to what has been seen and heard; giving the opportunity to worship God. This is followed by a time of prayer.
- We finish our worship with a liturgical ending (call and response).
- **Notices**
Notices need to be given some thought. Announcements are made before the collective act of worship rather than to blunt its impact or dispel the atmosphere that has been created by giving notices at the end.

Tutor Collective Worship follows the same 4 part format. The resources are made available in advance. **Year Collective Worship** also follows the format so that there is consistency and an embedded St Martin's way of Collective Worship across the school. All resources for Tutor Collective Worship are located in the staff shared area. These are powerpoint based resources which are easily accessible and inclusive for students of all faiths or no faith, and for tutors to amend according to their group.
