




A boy comes to terms with his identity as a mixed-race gay teen - then at university he finds his wings as a drag artist.




### You Should See Me in a Crown by Leah Johnson

Football, family, and love — Nick wrestles with problems at home, stands up to a bully, and tries to impress the girl of his dreams.




### The Infinite by Patience Agbabi

How do you save the world from monsters if no one will admit they exist?








### Miles Morales: Spider-Man by Jason Reynolds
