Visual Guidance to read alongside our Full School Reopening Risk Assessment



This visual guidance is for you to read alongside our full school reopening risk assessment

The government announced that all schools will reopen fully in September 2020 for all students. The school has put in place a risk assessment in line with the [government guidance](#) and system of controls to mitigate risk and keep everyone safe. You can read the details in full in the school Risk Assessment in response to COVID-19 for full school reopening in September [here](#). This visual representation will help you to understand the changes implemented on the outdoor grounds of the school and in the school buildings and to reassure you that every measure is taken to ensure the safety of all the students and staff as far as we are able to do so. The government has advised that from September, social distancing for students is not necessary. However, our aim is to keep students as far apart as is practicable. We will maintain the 2 metre distancing where possible, particularly for adults.

Outdoor demarcation with 2 metre distancing

The markings for social distancing start at the front gate where students will be asked to remove any PPE and sanitise their hands. The markings have been painted on the ground throughout the school.



Markings either by lines, dots, or body shape are evident throughout the school outdoor space. Each marking represents the 2 metre social distancing rule and gives everyone the reassurance of a safe distance between themselves and others.



The tennis courts have been designated for emergency evacuations and circles have been painted on the ground as a demarcation of where to stand with 2 metre social distancing in force.



Indoor demarcation with 2 metre distancing

A combination of two way corridors keeping left and some one way routes. Some staircases are two way with demarcation for keeping left and also one way routes on some staircases.



Sanitiser Stations

Sanitiser stations have been set up around the school. Also outdoors so that there is plenty of opportunity to sanitise their hands. This is in addition to students washing their hands with soap and water which will be a main part of personal hygiene and regularly enforced.



Outdoor sanitising facilities

The communal water fountains have been removed and replaced with wash hand basins. These provide additional facilities for students to adhere to the strict hygiene regime. There are also outdoor foot operated hand sanitiser stations located in different parts of the school grounds.



Hygiene Boxes

Each classroom will have a Hygiene Box containing a range of sanitising products. These are available for staff and students to use in the classroom to keep their hands clean and their space sanitised. Boxes will be refilled as requested. A Hygiene Box will also be in the Dining Plaza and in staff areas.



Safety Signage

There is signage throughout the school reminding students, staff and visitors of the procedures and government guidance.



Support from Student Services or Reception

Demarcation for students and staff to be clear about when to stand when they require support from a member of staff on students services or the main reception. Both areas have been fitted with perspex screening for additional safety.

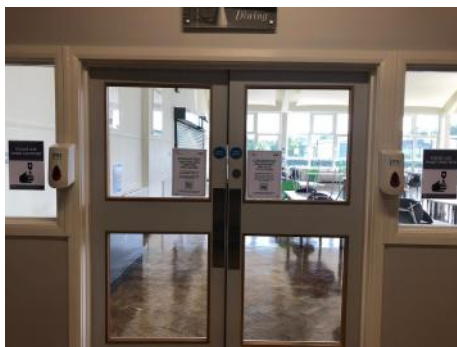


Plaza Dining

The arrangements for students to have lunch is set up within the guidelines of hand hygiene and social distancing. The circular tables have been removed and tables have been set up in rows front facing.

Lunch will be staggered to enable all students to have access to a hot meal and enable the lunch area to be cleaned in between use by different bubble groups.

Year 9 bubble will have lunch in the lower gym.
