Thank you to our parents who supported this event; shopping, cooking; organising tables, serving and clearing away. We need more parents on our Parent Partnership Group to support us with events. Fireworks - Shops at Upper Tulse Hill

Thank you for your support with ensuring that your daughter does not loiter around after school. She should go straight home, unless she has a club or intervention. Students have adhered to the expectation of only going to the shops at Upper Tulse Hill if it is absolutely necessary and leaving immediately after they have made their purchase. I am at the shop every day with another member of the senior team to ensure their safety during the firework season. Their safety is important to us inside and outside school. Thank you for supporting us with this matter. As in my previous letter to you, this procedure will continue at least until the end of November.

School Trousers

As part of our winter uniform we have introduced trousers and these can be worn after October half term until Easter. - Windrush Exhibition: Portrait of a Generation takes place at St. John's Angell Town.
 Monday to Saturday 2.00pm to 6.00pm Thursday 1 to Thursday 15 November 2018.
- 2. Exhibitions at the Black Cultural Archives in Brixton.
- 3. Africa on the Square takes place in Trafalgar Square on Saturday 27 October 2018. A free event from 12.00 midday until 6.00pm. This is a popular event that continues to grow, it will be the fourth time it is hosted. Over 25,000 people attended last year. It celebrates African arts and culture. There will be a stage with live entertainment, an African market, food and stalls, showcasing communities from across the continent.
- 4. Exhibition at the British Library until 21 October called Windrush Songs in a Strange Land. It is 70 years since the Empire Windrush carried hundreds of migrants to London. You can learn about the Jamaican feminist poet Una Marson, who became the first black woman employed by the BBC.
- 5. National Portrait Gallery to see Black is the New Black portraits by Simon Frederick. We have been fortunate to get tickets for an exclusive offer to meet the artist Simon Frederick for Year 10 and 11 Art students.
