Underachievement of Portuguese pupils in Lambeth - Virtual Event Sunday 29 November 2020

The Migrantes Unidos organisation have been aware that the academic achievement of Portuguese pupils in Lambeth has been the lowest of all nationality and ethnicity groups in the borough for a long time and became alarmed that the predictions of all educational experts is that educational inequalities will be greatly exacerbated by school closures in the first lockdown. They want to try to increase and mobilise the Portuguese community awareness of the issue to help deal with the situation.

The Migrantes Unidos has organised a Zoom meeting to inform the Portuguese community and initiate a discussion of what it might be able to do to help mitigate the problem. It will take place on **Sunday, 29 November at 2:30pm**. They have secured the full support of Lambeth Council and of the Portuguese Consul-General. Free School Meals

Thanks to the continued pressure by Marcus Rashford, the Government, through their Winter Package, has agreed to provide for children who are entitled to free school meals during the Christmas break and February half term. Lambeth LA has informed us that the amount has been increased to £20.00 per week. We will be supplying you with vouchers via Wonde. If you are not sure whether or not your child is entitled to free school meals, please get in touch with us and we can help you to find out.

Jewellery non uniform accessories

It is disappointing that some students are coming into school having had their nose or ears pierced knowing that our school rules do not permit this. Additionally it is worrying that students are doing this during a national lockdown and are risking their health and safety and that of others. We are in very challenging times and more than ever it is important that students respect and adhere to the rules and expectations. This also applies to hair colour, hair accessories, mobile phones hoodies and similar. We do not want to spend a disproportionate amount of time challenging non uniform accessories.
